EXHIBITION RULES

- 1 Exhibitors must be over 16 years and members of the Club. Unless otherwise stated in each section.
- 2 Entry into some classes may be forbidden to those who have entered similar classes. These are identified in the Schedule.
- 3 **Entry forms should be handed in before 9.30am on the morning of the show, signed by, and giving full address including post code of the exhibitor. There is no entry fee for fully paid up members or Junior exhibitors. £3.00 ENTRY FEE FOR ALL OTHER EXHIBITORS.**
- 4 No exhibitor is allowed to stage more than one exhibit in any one Class. All exhibitors must have the official label attached, (labels available in the Hall).

- 5 The hall will be open for Exhibitors to stage exhibits from 2.00pm until 10.00pm on the eve of the Show, and from 7.00am to 9.30am on the morning of the show.
- 6 All Competitors must have exhibits staged by 9.30am when all persons other than those appointed by the Show Manager, must leave the hall. Judging will begin by 10.00am.
- 7 **The Judges have the power to withhold or modify places. Also to award a fourth prize if merited.**
- 8 All competitors are held to declare that the produce exhibited by them, has been grown by them. Except for the Decorative classes.
- 9 The Committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without giving any reason therefore. They reserve the right to interview the competitor, and inspect the growing area before accepting an exhibit.
- 10 The Show Manager will direct the placing of all exhibits and exhibitors are expected to conform to any instructions given. The Committee may refuse any exhibit considered unworthy of being shown.
- 11 **The Judges decisions shall be final. No protest will be considered unless a violation of the Rules can be proved. Protests must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing before 2.00pm, plus a payment of £10.00, which will be refunded if the protest is upheld.**
- 12 The Committee will arrange for staging of exhibits forwarded for competition, but Exhibitors must take all risks and pay for all expenses. Permission must be obtained from the Show Manager before removing such exhibits.
- 13 Non-competitive exhibits should be intimated to the Secretary as soon as possible, together with the amount of space required.
- 14 The Judges are allowed to award 2 points to all Cut Flowers, Pot Plants, Fruits and Vegetable exhibits legibly and correctly named.
- 15 **No exhibits may be removed by Exhibitors before the end of the Show. Any Exhibitor unable to remove an exhibit at this time must notify the Secretary or the Show Manager so that appropriate arrangements can be made.**
- 16 Cut Flowers or Vegetables purposefully left behind, or left by prior arrangement on the show bench, will be sold on behalf of the Club at the close of the Show.
- 17 The Committee reserves the right to make decisions in all cases not provided by the Rules.
- 18 **Prize money will be paid after 1.00 pm on the day of the Show. If not collected within 14 days, will be forfeited. The Secretary or Treasurer will forward prize money by arrangement with the Exhibitor if the Exhibitor pays postage and expenses.**
- 19 Any Competitor not complying with the Rules of Exhibition may be liable to disqualification.
- 21 **The St Andrews & District Horticultural Society and Gardening Club will not be responsible for the loss or damage to: Plants, Flowers, Vegetables, or equipment, or any other article belonging to an exhibitor whilst in the Show. All ordinary care will be taken.**

TROPHIES

The Hall-Stewart Challenge Trophy. (Presented by the late Mrs. Stewart-Hall). This will be awarded to the competitor with the most points in the combined Fruit, Flower and Vegetable classes. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the most first prizes will be declared the winner.

The Low Challenge Trophy. (Presented by the late Miss J Low, OBE). This will be awarded to the competitor with the most points in the Fruit classes. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the most first prizes will be declared the winner. The Victory Challenge Trophy will be awarded to the competitor with the most points in the Flower classes. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the most first prizes will be declared the winner.

The Balnacarron Challenge Trophy. (Presented by Mr. W How). This will be awarded to the competitor with the most points in the Vegetable classes. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the most first prizes will be declared the winner.

The Charles McDermott Memorial Salver. (Presented by the late Mr. J Robertson, Kingskettle). This will be awarded to the competitor with the most points in the Pot Plants classes. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the most first prizes will be declared the winner.

The Hector Watt (Master Baker) Trophy. (Presented by Ms. F Christie). This will be awarded to the competitor with the most points in the Baking and Preserves classes. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the most first prizes will be declared the winner.

The Henry Anquetil Trophy. (Presented by the Family of the late Mr. H G P Anquetil) This will be awarded to the competitor with the Best Exhibit in the Cut Flower classes.

Trophies will be competed for annually, and held by the winners for one year.

Winners must notify and return the trophies to the Secretary 14 days before the date Annual Show.

Beans (runner), Carrots (other than long), Celery, Cucumbers (house/frame), Tomatoes - 18pts.

Beans (broad & French), Beetroot (globe & cylindrical), Cabbages, Onions (under 250gm), Turnips - 15pts.
